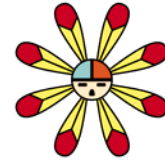

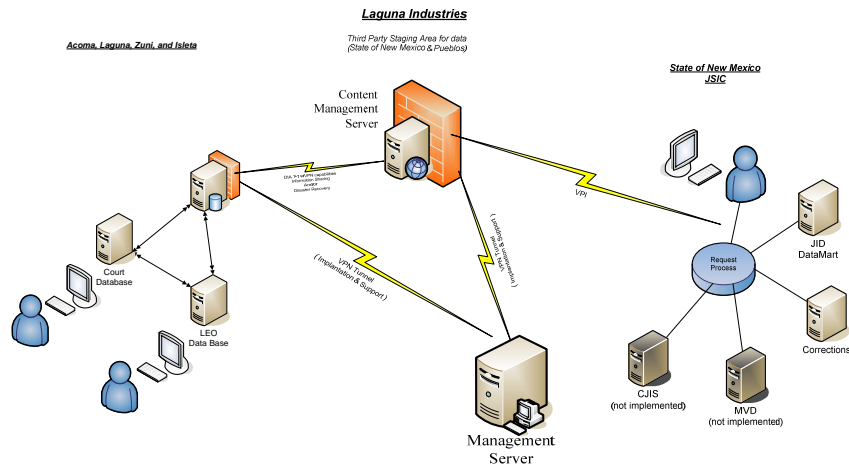
Central Location at Laguna Industries
